Richard's Desk



"a rose by any other name would smell as sweet"...and the above banners are different.

The first with "*the*" is my *newsletter* banner, the second with "Doc" is the *website* banner. There's a story behind the "Szpinner" part...

First, from my Polish heritage, the name "Szpin" has a silent 'Z' in it. The anglicized pronunciation is 'Spin.' Try saying that out loud, 'Spin, Spin, Szpin, Spin.' That's it. You got it. 'Spin .'

Next, most Polish and Ukrainian names have a suffix of 'ski' or 'sky.' My ancestral family was too poor to afford the suffix which the rich paid to the feudal lord to retain their full name. Not my family.

Then, I have never wanted or had the urge to change my name, really anglicize it as others in the family have done. 'Kuczynski,' my Polish aunt's surname didn't fly with one member of her family. He anglicized it to 'King.' Not in my bailiwick, never considered, never desired. So 'Szpin' it is, 'Szpin' it will remain. Short and sweet.

Next, I am dumbfounded why anglos cannot handle the spelling once they learn it even with the pronunciation. As in the alphabet, 'S' comes before 'Z'...so it's 'SZ.' It is amazing how many intelligent people just can't get it, thinking just throw a 'Z ' anywhere hoping it will hit the appropriate mark. Heavens, you're not making a salad, randomly tossing in a "z" anywhere. It isn't 'spzin' or 'spinz.' It's 'szpin.' That's a mental laziness I avoided as a teacher, as a school administration and as a school board executive. I have always paid close attention to how people spell their names and how they pronounce them. It's called respect and regard.

Then, 'Szpinner,' (pronounced 'spinner,')...many years ago a number of colleagues met weekly for a Friday afternoon cocktail, many of the group were school administrators or school board executives. They joked that I was a story teller, a raconteur, not fabricator. In any case, one of them started calling me '<u>Doc Szpinner</u>.' The name stuck. Hence, the sobriquet "Szpinner' in my two banners.

And now you have the rest of the story.

Many leaders, politicians and elected officials have paid lip service to 'anti-hate' philosophies. Not that they aren't doing something about the battle, but the seriousness of their fight is questionable.

They boast of anti-hate, anti-violence policies and programs they have launched. These may be no more than mere words. Leaders, all of them, flap their gums and flip their lips in claims of how much they are doing in the battle against hate.

Americans are worse. Their hate crime rate is off the charts. Consider this for a moment: their Republican candidate for VP nominee, J.D. Vance, in his acceptance speech bragged about his grandmother, his 'mawmaw,' having 19 loaded guns in her 'Ozark' home, one or two in every room of the house. That's criteria for safe and secure living? As a Canadian, how many guns do you have in your home?

Somehow, these promises, policies and programs about which government leaders and elected representatives boast are supposed to be worthy of acclamation and appreciation. Be aware, we live in times of misinformation and fake news. You will hear that our violent crimes statistics are decreasing. It takes little searching to disclaim this 'fact.' Violence, crime and incidents of hate are increasing everywhere.

What are the leaders and government ministers actually doing other than claiming they are doing a lot? If they are doing so much, how do they explain the difference between their policies and the number of hate crimes/incidents occuring? What are those policies? Increased police forces? Increased sentences? Increased bail amounts? Better equipped police forces? Whatever they're doing, it isn't working if the statistics are examined.

Is there a possible solution? Consider this possibility: leaders and politicians assess and examine the statistics relating to hate. If they are increasing, the policies need review and modification. Does 'increasing' any aspect of the policies and programs have an effect? If it doesn't, consider changing it. But is changing them to 'more' the answer? It's not working so far. Then, what alternatives or modifications or supplements need to be considered? This would take effort, time and energy. Politicians support hot air not effective government programs. Blow more hot air and the balloons rise, permitting you to boast that you are doing something. 'Hooty patooty' politicians! You aren't doing what is necessary or what works. If you were honest about your work you would assess, evaluate and modify your efforts. Are we to just sit in this quagmire of hate, misogyny, bigotry and racism in which we are currently mired and continue living in this muck?

NEIGHBOURHOOD ASSOCIATION INC.

Last week a park model trailer was placed in the side yard of 621 West Shore Blvd. and advertised an Airb&b for \$260/night. The house sold recently and whoever the new owner(s) is (are), I guess they think there are no bylaws in place. Our Association has been fully involved with the "Infill and Replacement Housing in Established Neighbourhoods" for 6 years, since amalgamated zoning bylaws was first proposed in 2016 by the two Ward 1 Councillors, Maurice Brenner and Kevin Ashe. Ever since then, builders, buyers and contractors have pushed the envelope to build bigger, higher, and wider.

Fairport Beach Neighbourhood Association has acted as good corporate neighbours in keeping an eye on what goes into our community. Not every buyer is thinking of moving or living here for life. Some are speculators and some are from other countries looking to invest their money in a safe market. They have no interest in what is best for a community, but rather how much profit can be made from building the biggest structure.

Now, this same party has applied to build a new house on this lot, and have the house sit 1.5 meters from the front property line(bylaw requires 7.5 m) and 10.3 meters in height (bylaw requires 9 m max.). These are called minor variances before the Committee of Adjustments. If no neighbour objects then the applicant has a good chance that they may get approval.

Human nature being what it is, most people will not object and don't understand the process anyway. FBNA has been around since 1927 and Incorporated since 1949. We will look at applications with a critical eye and apply the new standards under bylaw 2511 as amended.

We commend and welcome new builds and good neighbours to our special community of Fairport Beach.
