Words to Inspire: Spring Edition

Dear Richard,

I'm sitting by our fireplace looking out over the brown grass that recently appeared since my last letter, written while in Colombia. From the snowstorms of February to the promise of this new season, Spring. Oh, the HOPE of new life, the dead of winter to sprouting crocuses and daffodils.

My three-week trip to Colombia is now a wonderful memory. Before I leave this journey behind, I want to share with you a side trip I took on March 2-4. I left my Canadian team and flew to Medellin.

I don't speak Spanish, so travelling on my own gave me pause, but I quickly remembered that my constant companion is the Lord Himself—who could better help me if needed? I talked a lot to my travelling partner and arrived safely and on time. Hilary, Darren, and Mark made sure that I was well looked after, but it was delightful to remember that I am never alone.

This addition to the Women Together mission gave me the opportunity to join my nephew Mark, his wife Karen, and their son Nathan, at the Prison Fellowship International gathering in the beautiful city of Medellin.

A small group from Canada and the US met with organizers of Prison Fellowship Colombia. PFI was founded by Chuck Colson over forty years ago, and I was able to observe some of the wonderful programs this Christian organization offers.

The introduction on Sunday night included a talk from the Colombian director, Lácides Hernández. I was struck by the accountability, forgiveness, and making amends that is required of the prisoners. Victims, offenders, and community members meet and decide how to bring reconciliation, and the results are transformative. In fact, it is called transformative justice.



One offender shared his story, which included murders. At the end, he broke down and sobbed while asking forgiveness of everyone in the room, including me. He grieved over the suffering he had caused the victims.

I left copies of the four English WOW studies to be used as needed in the prisons. I believe God has more for the WOW series in women's prisons. Perhaps that is why I had the extra journey to Medellin.




Just look at the women all receiving their Words To Inspire certificate for completing Woman of Wisdom. Can't you sense the joy on their faces?
